Please note the following rules because they will be used by the Exhibit Workers.

*No premium money will be paid for exhibits not listed in this premium list. Bring your address labels to make entry easier and faster for the workers.

*No person can have more than one entry per category.

*Persons eligible to exhibit – Wood Lake Trade Area.

*No other booths or displays.

*Not responsible for lost or damaged exhibits.

*Exhibitors planning to exhibit should study the premium list carefully and bring in exhibits that are on the premium list.

*Careful selection of exhibits will help make a nice display and will also make for closer competition.

*Exhibits will be open to the public from 4:30-7 p.m. on Tuesday 4:30 to 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday (except during parades)

*Exhibits should be removed by 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday.

*Premiums will be paid after judging and available on Tuesday.

*The Exhibit Hall - closed during the parades and stage shows.

*For all of the following Divisions and Classes, first prize will be \$2.00 and second prize will be \$1.00. There will also be an “oddy” prize of \$1.00 for the largest or most unusual entry.

Potatoes-Division A

Kennebec, Norland, Pontiac, Red, Russet, Any Other Variety (Three potatoes per entry)

Vegetables-Division B

Beans, green pod(6); Beans, yellow pod (6); Beets, table(3); Cabbage(1); Carrots(3); Cauliflower (1); Cucumbers, ripe(3); Cucumbers, pickling(3); Cucumbers, slicing(3); Egg Plant(1); Kohlrabi(1); Okra(2); Onions, white(3); Onions, yellow(3); Onions, red(3); Radish, with tops(3); Pea Pods(6); Pepper-Banana(2); Pepper- Green (2); Pepper- Habanero (2); Pepper- Jalapeño (2); Pepper-Red(2); Pumpkin, field(1); Pumpkin, pie(1); Rhubarb(3); Squash, Acorn(1); Squash, Buttercup(1); Squash, Butternut(1); Squash, Summer(1); Sweet Corn(3); Tomatoes, cherry/grape (3); Tomatoes, large red(3); Tomatoes, small red(3); Tomatoes, large yellow(3); Tomatoes, small yellow(3); Tomatoes, Roma(3); Turnips(1); Zucchini(1).

Fruit-Division C

Apples, crab (3); Apples, any variety (3); Pears (3); Plums (3); Strawberries (5); Watermelon (1); Muskmelon (1); Honey Dew Melon (1); Misc.

Grain-Division D

Wheat, winter; Wheat, spring; Oats, early, medium, late;

Soybeans.

Amount of above entries- 1 quart of crop grain; 3” sheaf of soybeans.

Field Corn-Division E

(3) ears of each of 90, 95, 100, 105, 110-day maturity.

Forages-Division F

Hay-Bales (4” slice in a box); Hay-Chopped (1/4 bushel in box); Silage; Alfalfa, Corn, Oats (Silage must be in Qt. jar and sealed).

Oddities-Division G

Home Environment-Division H

Special rules for the following classes:

1. Only articles which are the product of the home environment are eligible.
2. It is advisable to bring cakes or pies on plates which have no value or on squares of thin cardboard or stiff heavy paper, as the management cannot be responsible for individual plates.
3. It is advisable to bake bread for exhibition in individual loaves, about 3x4x8”.
4. Any article receiving a premium in the fancy work division in previous years at the Wood Lake Fair is not eligible.

Bread-Class A

White yeast bread, dark bread, cinnamon rolls, biscuits or buns (1/4 dozen); quick bread, muffins, lefse-3 5” rounds.

Cakes-Class B

Angel food (unfrosted); Devil’s Food or Chocolate Sponge Cake (unfrosted); Light Cake (unfrosted); Spice Cake (unfrosted); Cup Cakes (1/4 dozen); Jelly Roll; Coffee Cake.

Cookies and Donuts-Class C

(¼ dozen per entry)

Drop Cookies; Filled Cookies; Molded Cookies; Oatmeal Cookies; Rolled Cookies; Overnight Cookies; Bars; Brownies. Plain Donuts; Raised Donuts.

Pies-Class D

(Small or Individual Pies)

Fruit Pie; Cream Pie, Custard Pie.

Canned Goods

If possible, it is preferred that you bring displays of canned goods in pint jars.

Put method and time on jars of canned goods.

Canned Vegetables-Class E

Beets, Carrots, Corn, String Beans, green; String Beans, wax; Peas, Tomatoes; Salsa; Pizza Sauce; Spaghetti Sauce; Misc. Vegetables.

Canned Fruit-Class F

Apples; Applesauce; Apricots; Blueberries; Cherries; Ground Cherries; Gooseberries; Pears; Peaches; Plums; Raspberries; Rhubarb; Strawberries, Misc.

Pickles-Class G

Apple; Bean; Beet; Peach; Bread and Butter; Dill; Sweet Cucumber; Watermelon; Relish; Misc.

Jams-Class H

Apricot; Blueberry, Gooseberry; Ground Cherry; Grape; Mulberry; Peach; Plum; Raspberry; Rhubarb; Strawberry; Tomato; Misc.

Jelly-Class I

Apple; Cherry; Chokecherry; Current; Gooseberry; Grape; Peach; Pepper, Plum; Raspberry; Strawberry; Honey; Misc.

Canned Meats-Class J

Beef; Chicken; Pork; Misc.

Candies-Class K

Brittle; Caramels; Divinity; Fudge; Taffy.

Flowers-Class L

Bring flower entries in pint or quart jars.

Allium; Aster; Bachelor Button; Balsam; Begonia; Black-Eyed Susan; Calendula; Chrysanthemum; Cockscomb; Cocktail; Coleus; Cosmos; Dahlia; Daisy; Gaillardia; Gladiolus; Iris; Larkspur; Lily; Marigold; Nasturtium; Pansy; Petunia; Phlox; Pinks; Rose; Salvia; Sedum; Snapdragon; Strawflower; Sweet Pea; Verbena; Viola; Zinnia; Potted Plant; Mixed Bouquet; Wild Flower Arrangement; Flower Arrangement for Table Centerpiece

Handicraft-Class M

(3 categories; Adult, Children up thru age 11 and Juniors 12-16)
Bead work; Ceramics; Coloring; Christmas Ornaments; Decoupage; Hoop craft; Loomed rugs; Pencil Art; Wall hangings; Painting (acrylic, canvas, number painting, oil, tempera, tole, water) Purses/totes; Stained Glass; Wood burning; Woodworking.

Fancy Work-Class N

(3 categories; Adult, Children up thru age 11 and Juniors 12-16)
Applique; Aprons: embroidered, sewn; Baby Blankets; Clothing; Crewel; Cross Stitch, counted, stamped; Crocheting: Afghan, Dish Cloths, Garments, rugs; Dish Towels: hand embroidered, machine embroidered, painted; Embroidery; Hardanger; Latch Hook; Luncheon Cloths; Knitted: Afghan; Dish cloths, Garments-adult; Garments-children; Needlepoint; Pillow Cases; Pillow Tops; Pot holders; Rugs, hooked; Quilts: embroidered, computer stitched, hand stitched, machine stitched, tied; Sewn items; Stuffed Toys; Table Runner

Other Crafts-Class O

(3 categories; Adult, Children up thru age 11 and Juniors 12-16)
Drawing: marker, colored pencil; Greeting cards/invitations; Stamping; Jewelry; Photography; Scrap Booking; Recycling-All green, glass, metal, plastic
